## In order to get peace you must be self-disciplined. You must conquer...

<u>laziness</u> -	Diligent hands will rule, but laziness ends in slave labor. ( <b>Proverbs</b> 12:24)
disorganization –	The plans of the diligent lead to profit as surely as haste leads to poverty. ( <b>Proverbs 21:5</b> ; cf 24:27)
self- <u>indulgence</u> -	He who loves pleasure will be poor; whoever loves wine and oil will never be rich. (Proverbs 21:17; cf 13:4)
misplaced <u>values</u> -	The lazy do not roast any game, but the diligent feed on the riches of the hunt. ( <b>Proverbs 12:27</b> )
<u>loner</u> mentality -	There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death. ( <b>Proverbs 14:12; 16:25</b> )

## Our <u>model</u> for self-discipline is <u>lesus</u>

"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are-yet was without sin." (Hebrews 4:15)
